Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois, represented in the General Assembly:

4 Section 5. The Child Labor Law is amended by adding Section 5 12.5 as follows:

(820 ILCS 205/12.5 new)

Sec. 12.5. Child performers; trust fund.

(a) In this Section:

9 "Artistic or creative services" includes, but is not 10 limited to, services as: an actor, actress, dancer, musician,

16 "Child performer" means an unemancipated person under the 17 age of 16 who is employed in this State and who agrees to 18 render artistic or creative services.
